Introduction

ASK Students

Have you ever moved to a new home or town? If you have not moved homes, think about moving to a new class in your school each year. What did you first explore in this new place?

How long did it take to make new friends? What was it like to move? Was it scary? Or fun?

TELL Students

The Pilgrims moved to a new home. **Pilgrims** were early settlers who traveled from Europe to North America on a ship called the Mayflower. The **Mayflower** is the ship the Pilgrims boarded for their historic voyage across the Atlantic Ocean. The Pilgrims were unhappy in England so they moved to the Netherlands. TELL Students

Before coming to America, the Pilgrims left England and traveled to the Netherlands in 1608. TELL Students

After more than ten years in the Netherlands, some of the Pilgrims decided to move again. However, they were still looking for a place where they could live and worship freely. So, in 1620, the Pilgrims boarded the Mayflower in England and set off for the New World. Their **voyage** would last more than two months and would be very difficult. The ship had just over 100 men, women, and children. Some of them were searching for religious freedom, while others left in search of economic opportunities. Journey of Faith: The Pilgrims' Quest for Freedom and Survival

TELL Students

Aboard the Mayflower, the Pilgrims sat below deck and rarely went outside. The Mayflower went through a really bad storm that blew them off course, which brought them to **Plymouth** (in present-day Massachusetts). The first winter they experienced was very dangerous. The lack of good food and the bad diseases led to the death of more than half of the original Pilgrims who were aboard the Mayflower.

Even though this sounds like a horrible experience, it was not long before the Pilgrims got help from the **Native Americans** and were able to survive in the New World. Ultimately this partnership led to the first **Thanksgiving**. Let's watch another Learn More With Liberty video to learn more!
