Introduction

ASK Students

What is your favorite holiday? Why?

What are some things you enjoy doing on your favorite holiday?

(allow students to respond)

TELL Students

The holiday we are exploring in this course is Thanksgiving. What do you remember about the first Thanksgiving? How did Thanksgiving become a national holiday in America? Let's review a few things. In 1620, the Pilgrims boarded the Mayflower and set off for the New World. Pilgrims were early settlers who traveled from Europe to North America on a ship called the Mayflower. The **Mayflower** is the ship the Pilgrims boarded for their historic voyage across the Atlantic Ocean. They left England because they were not allowed to practice their faith freely. Their voyage to early America would last more than two months and would be very difficult. When they finally landed, the Pilgrims realized they were not alone in their new home. There were many different Native American communities in the **New World**, or early America. Some of the Native American communities had been there for thousands of years.

Introduction

TELL Students

The first Thanksgiving would not have been possible without a native man named Squanto. **Squanto** was a Native American who became an early friend to the Pilgrims. As the Pilgrims struggled to build a community and prepare for winter, Squanto was introduced to them by another Native American named Samoset. **Samoset** was the first Native American to make contact with the Pilgrims. Both Squanto and Samoset spoke English, and Squanto was tasked by the Wampanoag tribe with helping the Pilgrims. Squanto showed the Pilgrims how to plant crops, such as corn, where the best fishing spots were, and showed them where to hunt beaver.

In the fall of 1621, the Pilgrims engaged in a feast to give thanks, which today we remember as the first Thanksgiving. The Pilgrims who gathered together to celebrate had a lot to be grateful for. At this time, America had just won independence from England after a long, hard war. Washington designated a day to express gratitude to God for the blessings bestowed upon the colonists. Washington believed God protected the colonists, helped America win the war and guided the establishment of a new government. Let's watch an episode of Star Spangled Adventures to learn more!

In 1789, America's first president, President George Washington, issued a proclamation that called for a national day of thanks. A **proclamation** is an official public announcement. At this time, America had just won independence from England after a long and hard war. Washington set aside a day to thank God for the blessings He had bestowed upon the colonists because he believed it was God who protected the colonists, helped America win the war, and guided the creation of a new government.

In 1863, when Americans were divided and fighting against each other during the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln issued another proclamation. President Lincoln realized that even though America was gripped by violence, hatred, and evil, the unity of our country was worth saving. Joining together in gratitude is a unifying experience that bridges people with diverse beliefs, appearances, and ideas. The Pilgrims and the Native Americans exemplified this during the first Thanksgiving.

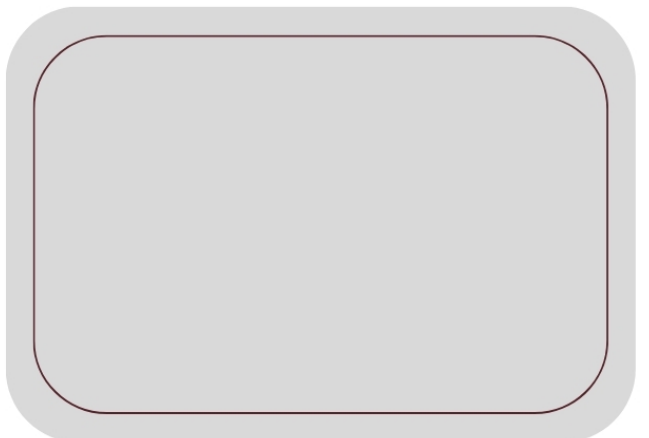

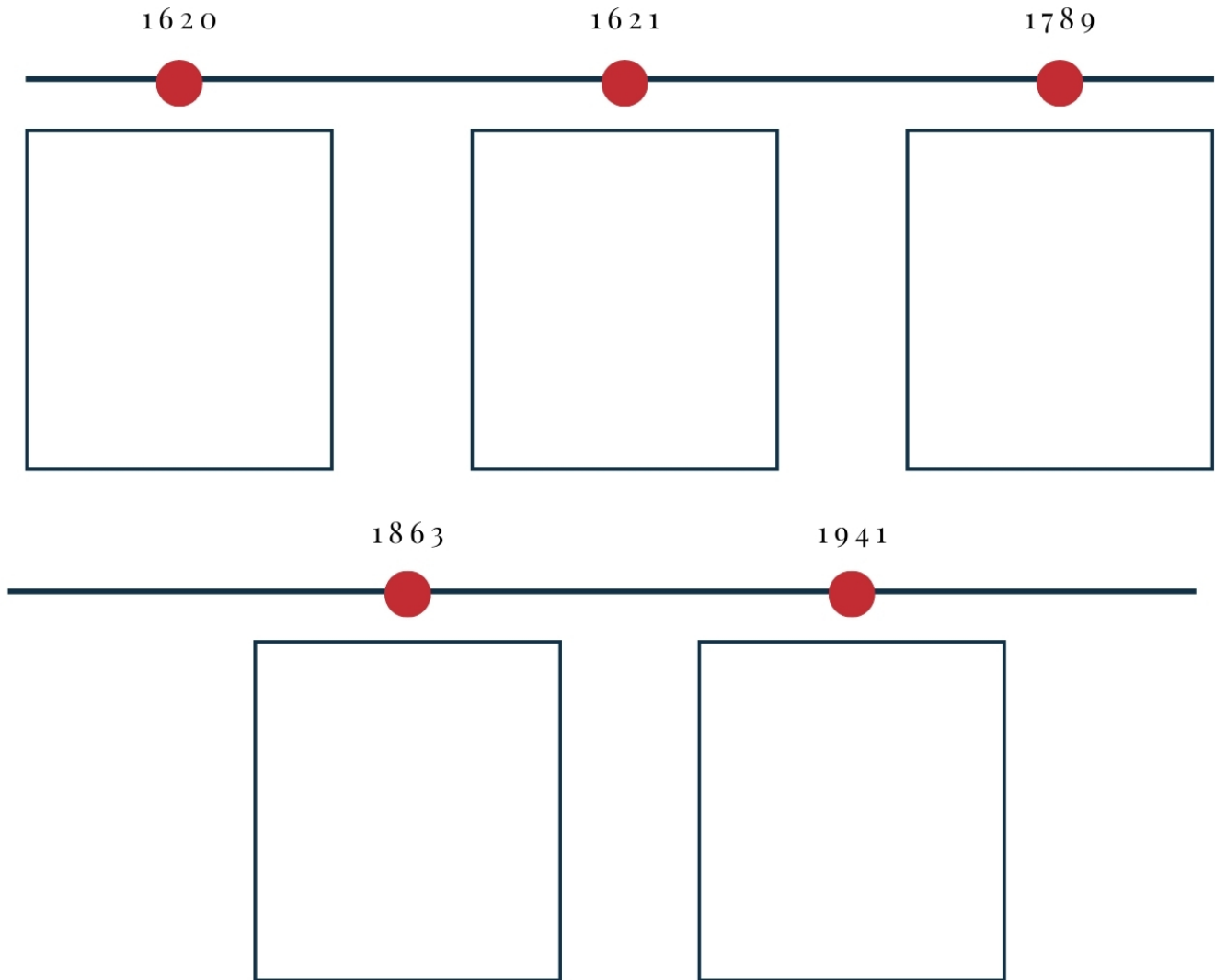
