



George Washington was a very important leader in America's history. He was our first president and did many great things for our country. His life made a big impact on our country. The way he lived his life inspired many people. It still inspires people today.

ASK Students

What does life mean?

(allow students to respond)

TELL Students

The word 'life' means to **experience** the world and the people around you. The word can also be used to describe how someone might have lived. The word 'life' can explain how your body works and how you spend your time. It is also an idea as well as a feeling. When you think of the word 'life' you may want to think about these questions:

- 01 What is the most important group of people in your life?
- 02 What are some of the things that impact your life each and every day?
- 03 In what ways do people like teachers, leaders and authority figures impact your life?

When George Washington agreed to lead the Continental Army, victory for the patriots was not guaranteed. General Washington knew they might fail, and life would be lost. But, he was willing to risk everything. He dedicated everything to ensure Americans have the right to life and freedom.

TELL Students

Many say George Washington is the greatest leader our country has ever had. Of all the Founding Fathers, George Washington is the most important. He was born on February 22, 1732, in Virginia. He had gone to school for only five years when his father died. He dreamed of becoming a sailor in the British Royal Navy. Because of this dream, he wanted to go to sea. His mother, however, had heard dangerous stories about seamen and did not want him to live that kind of life. George Washington was likely disappointed but he did what his mother asked. When he was 17 years old, he worked as a land surveyor, which means he measured and looked at land. This job helped him learn a lot about America's land, and it was useful when he became a soldier.

In 1754, he became a major in the Virginia Militia, where he worked with the British. Later, in 1775, he had to fight against the British in a war for America's freedom.

When he agreed to lead the American soldiers, he knew it wouldn't be easy. But he was ready to risk everything to help America be free. After a long fight, the British surrendered, and America became free.

TELL Students

When America needed a leader, everyone thought of George Washington. He didn't want to be **president** at first, but he agreed in 1789. He served as president for two terms and did a good job. In 1797, he retired.

George Washington always thought about what was best for the American people. He wanted to be a good example and lead with fairness and honesty. That's why he is remembered as a great leader in our history.



Washington Timeline




Using the blank timeline of George Washington's life, match the following events to the year in which they occurred:
