# Relevant Scripture

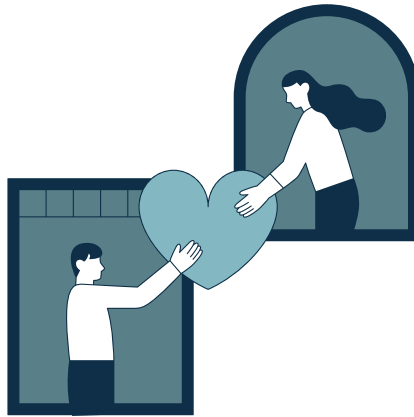
## Memory Verse

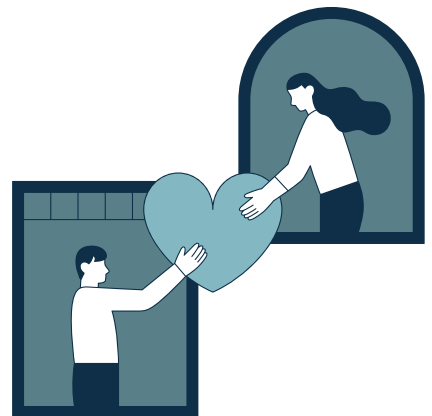

# Exploring Equality in the Bible

## A Mini-Lesson

**Objective:** Students will learn about the concept of equality as presented in the Bible and understand how Booker T. Washington's teachings align with biblical principles of equality.

**Materials:**
