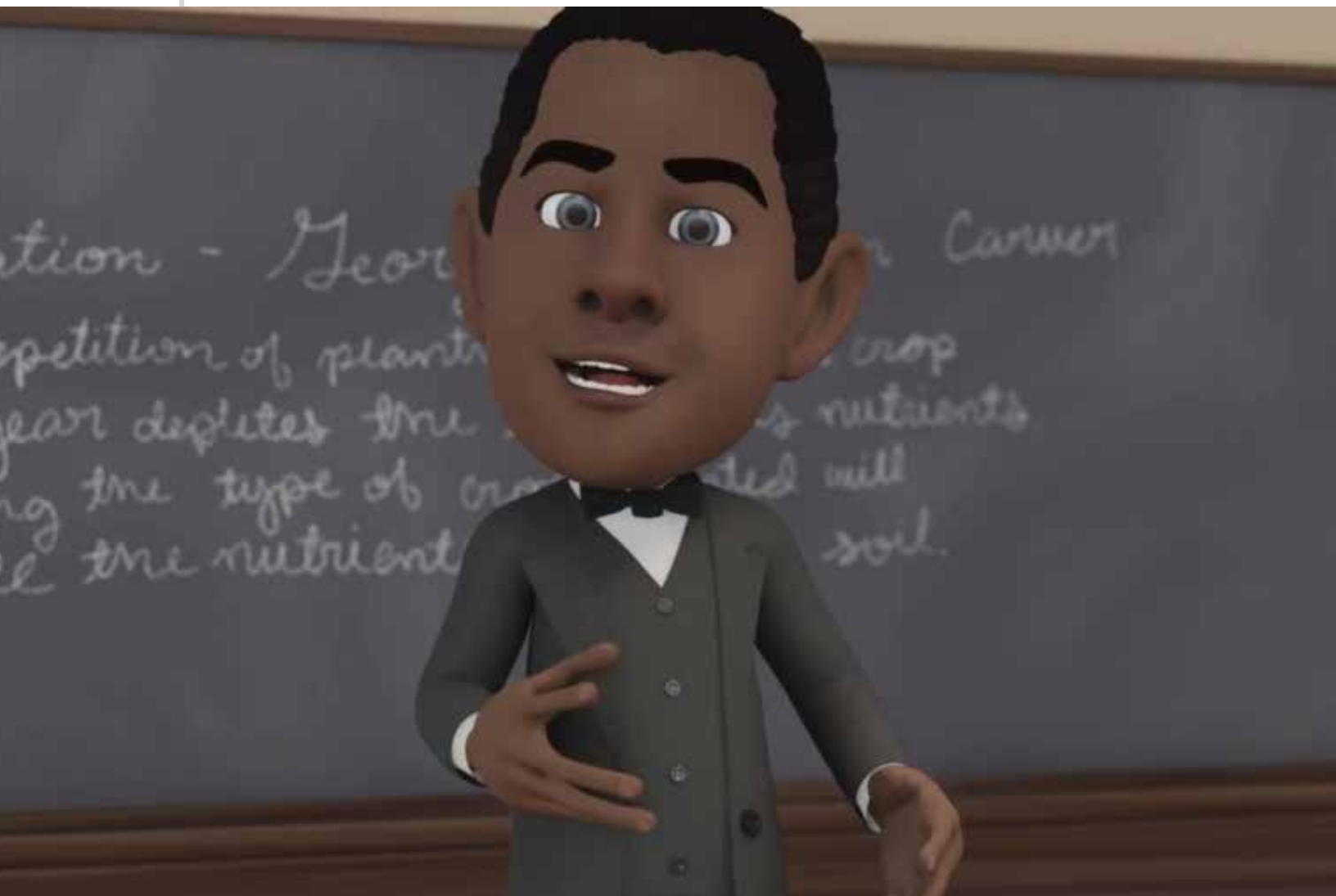
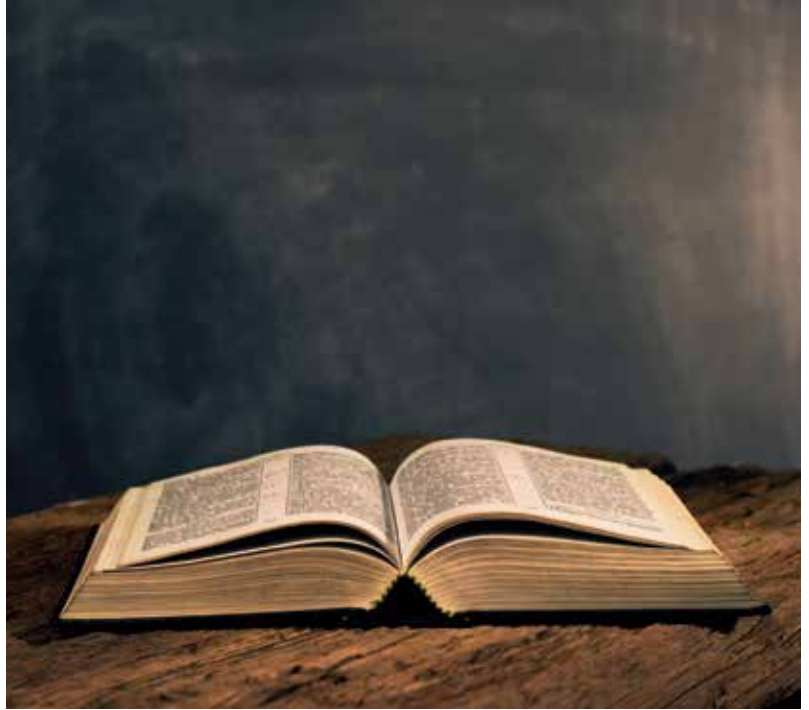

Matthew 22:39

“And the second [commandment] is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’”

Additional Verses for Context:

Leviticus 19:18: Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself...I am the Lord.

Galatians 3:28: There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

Faith Supplement Instructional Goals

- Assist students in understanding that we are all equally created by God.
- Help students grasp the parallels between Biblical teachings on equality and Booker T. Washington's concepts of equality.
- Teach students that showing dignity and respect to everyone is a way of honoring God.

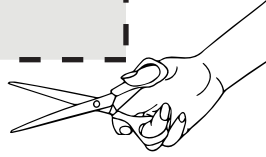

Exploring Equality in the Bible

A Mini-Lesson

Objective: Students will learn about the concept of equality as presented in the Bible and understand how Booker T. Washington's teachings align with biblical principles of equality.

Materials:

1. Bible passages related to equality (e.g., Galatians 3:28, Matthew 22:39, Leviticus 19:18)
2. whiteboard and markers or chart paper and markers
3. pictures and information about Booker T. Washington's life
4. Bible
