Instructional Goals

- **Understand the Concept of Unity:** Students will comprehend what unity means and recognize its importance in building a strong community, both in historical and biblical contexts.
- Connect Historical Themes to Biblical Teachings: Students will explore how the themes of unity and working together in George Washington's Farewell Address relate to teachings in the Bible.
- Memorize and Interpret the Memory Verse: Students will memorize Psalm 133:1 and discuss its meaning, relating it to their own experiences of unity.
- **Enhance Bible Literacy:** Students will practice locating and reading verses in their Bibles, improving their familiarity with scripture.
- Encourage Reflection on Leadership and Influence: Students will consider how leaders like George Washington and teachings from the Bible can guide their actions and interactions with others.



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Washington's Farewell Address

Objectives

- To introduce students to George Washington's Farewell Address in an ageappropriate manner.
- To explore how the themes of unity and leadership in Washington's address relate to biblical teachings.
- To encourage students to use their Bibles to find and read relevant scriptures.
- To engage students in a fun and interactive activity that reinforces the lesson.

Materials Needed

- Simplified excerpts from George Washington's Farewell Address (provided below)
- Children's Bibles or age-appropriate Bible storybooks
- Whiteboard or chart paper
- Markers or crayons
- Construction paper
- Glue and scissors
- Stickers and decorative items (optional)

Introduction

- Welcome and Prayer:
 - Begin the class with a simple prayer asking God to help us learn and understand.
- Warm-Up Activity:
 - Ask students, "What does it mean to work together?" and "Why is working together important?"
 - Write their answers on the board.

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Washington's Farewell Address

Memory Verse Activity

- Introduce the Memory Verse:
 - Read Psalm 133:1 aloud together.
- Discussion:
 - Explain what "unity" means in simple terms (getting along, helping each other).
 - Ask students how they feel when everyone gets along.

Introducing George Washington

- Story Time:
 - Share a brief story about who George Washington was:
 - The first President of the United States.
 - A leader who helped start our country.
- Farewell Address Simplified:
 - Explain that when George Washington stopped being president, he wrote a special letter to everyone.

Reading Excerpts

- Simplified Excerpts:
 - On Unity:
 - "We should all stick together as one big family to keep our country strong."
 - On Working Together:
 - "Let's be careful not to fight among ourselves, because it can make us weak."

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Group Reading

- Read the excerpts aloud with the students.
- Ask them what they think George Washington is trying to say.

Connecting to the Bible

- Bible Exploration:
 - Help students find Psalm 133:1 in their Bibles.
 - Discussion:
 - How does this verse relate to what George Washington said?
 - Why does God want us to live together in unity?
- Additional Scripture:
 - o Ephesians 4:32:
 - "Be kind and compassionate to one another."
 - Read and discuss how kindness helps us stay united.

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UNITY CHAIN CRAFT

Materials Needed

- Strips of construction paper (about 1 inch wide)
- Markers or crayons
- Glue or tape

Instructions

- Give each student several strips of paper.
- On each strip, students write or draw ways they can promote unity and kindness (e.g., "Help a friend," "Share toys," "Say kind words").
- Connect the strips to form a paper chain.
- Combine all the students' chains to make one large class unity chain.

Discussion

- Hang the chain in the classroom as a reminder.
- Talk about how each of us contributes to unity.
- Just like George Washington and the Bible teach us, when we work together and are kind to one another, we make our world a better place!

Recap and Closing

- Review Key Points:
 - o George Washington wanted us to work together and be united.
 - The Bible teaches us the importance of living in harmony.
- Memory Verse Repetition:
 - Repeat Psalm 133:1 together.
- Closing Prayer:
 - Thank God for teaching us about unity and ask for help to be kind and work together.

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Assessment

- Participation:
 - o Observe students' engagement during discussions and activities.
- Craft Activity:
 - Check that students contributed to the unity chain with thoughtful ideas.
- Memory Verse:
 - Encourage students to practice the verse at home.

Extension Activities

- Unity Role-Play:
 - Have students act out scenarios where they practice unity and kindness.
- Story Sharing:
 - Ask students to share times when they worked together with others.

Notes for Teachers

- Simplify Concepts:
 - Keep explanations clear and age-appropriate.
- Encourage Sharing:
 - Make sure all students have a chance to participate.
- Be Supportive:
 - o Help students look up Bible verses, offering guidance as needed.
